COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

- ▶ We have received word that 2 of our nominees for the Small Business (Flagstaff) awards have been selected. More next month.
- ▶ We had a visitor who brought forward the idea of having a shuttle bus to other communities for doctors, dentists, lawyers, shopping, etc. This is part of our strategic plan, as well as the county's strategic plan, and we hope to address it in the future.
- ▶ A delegation from the Museum requested assistance in purchasing the McDermott Shop for the museum. Council has since purchased the building, and a lease agreement will be negotiated with the Museum society to repay the Village. Meanwhile fund-raising by the Museum Society continues.
- ▶ We have applied to the Province for Disaster Recovery assistance, so we hope that those residents who experienced expensive damages from the July 12 storm will be helped out
- ▶ A resident was given permission to remove a tree to accommodate a driveway to their property, on condition that they plant a new tree in the Village.
- ▶ Decided to continue insuring the arena at the value of \$530,000,
- ▶ We will be participating with the other communities in Flagstaff in applying for a grant to equip all our waterplants with remote monitoring equipment in preparation for forming an operator's consortium. This will ensure that we always have qualified water operators on duty for all waterplants at all times.
- ▶ The October meeting will be held on Oct. 4 due to our regular date being election day. The Organizational meeting will follow on October 25.
- ▶ First reading was given to a bylaw to amend our Land-Use bylaw to rezone 3 lots to C!
- ▶ We have requested that Battle River School Division demolish the center and east parts of the school. Once done, the Village will receive the remainder and the land. We have been approached by investors who have plans for that part of the school.
