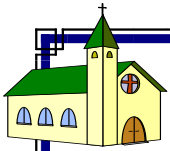

Youth Program

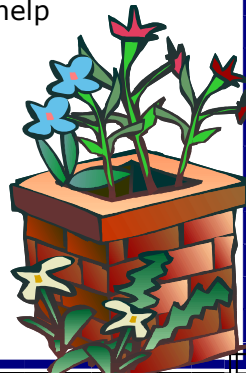
The Mighty A-Town Youth held their first meeting on February 12th and had a great time planning some fun and constructive activities for the future.

COUNCIL NOTES

Recreation— Flagstaff County recently began implementing the recommendations they received in their Recreation study. Village Council joined Strome, Galahad and Heisler to hear about the “Master Recreation Plan” that will guide the County’s policies and decision making when it comes to funding recreation within the County boundaries.

Grant funding— We received word that some Provincial grants have been reduced and others eliminated. This year we are eligible for :
\$ 50,000 Federal Gas Tax,
\$ 127,732 MSI Capital ,
\$ 43,660 MSI Operating
\$ 14,566 Street Improvement Program (which must be matched with \$ 4,855 Village funds.)
While this is a substantial amount of grants, each grant comes with rules that must be followed which can make it very challenging to meet the criteria and actually get the cash!!

- § relocating playground – gather opinions of public

Sustainability Plan – suggestions for focus for this year include:

- § work towards a community bus
- § promote our new lots
- § help sustain our businesses
- § annex the properties that border the village
