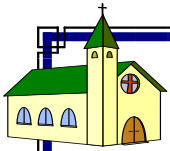

## Norman Johnston Memorial Fund



A big thank you to all who attended and supported the auction sale of Norman's household contents on September 20, 2009, with net proceeds for the Norman Johnston Memorial Fund. Special thanks to those who worked so hard preparing for the sale, helping at the sale, and cleaning up afterward. Thanks also to Aaron and Dixie for allowing us to rent their facility for the sale.

After Norman's niece and nephew, Hilary and Brock, selected the items they wanted from the house last summer, it was their wish that the remainder be sold or donated for the benefit of the Alliance community. They appointed Vernon Spady and Roger Spady to jointly administer that process. After numerous paintings, books, and other items were donated to the Alliance museum, the Library and Village Office, there remained an amazing quantity of items for sale. Many people remarked that it seemed impossible for all those things to have come out of Norman's house.

In addition to the auction, which was a great success, there were other sales & donations.

Thank you to Scott Peacock for transporting to Edmonton the remaining books (approximately 1500) that had not already been sold or donated. The majority of those were donated to the University of Alberta in Norman's name, and payment for the others will be made to the memorial fund from the book dealer.

We were also very pleased that Brock & Hilary agreed to the donation of Norman's 3300 vinyl records and 2500 CDs (almost entirely classical music) to Augustana University in Camrose, in Norman's name. Norman would be happy knowing that his beloved music and book collections will be used and appreciated.

The memorial fund will amount to in excess of \$ 25,000 once all sales are complete. Decisions on allocation will be made after all funds are in and suggestions are received and considered.

All of Norman's remaining paintings (between 100 and 150), being the unframed ones, will be offered for sale at the Day at the Gallery, at Alliance Community Hall on November 7, 2009. All proceeds will be added to the memorial fund.
