INGREDIENTS

- 10 oz Chicken Breast
- 1 Clove of garlic
- Pinch of Oregano 1 Spring of fresh Coriander
- Salt to taste
- 1lb White Onion
- 14 oz Green Pepper
- 7 oz Tomatoes
- Oil
- 6 Limes
- 2 Chicken bouillon cube
- 4 Tortillas cut in strip and fried

RECIPE

Cook the chicken with garlic, oregano, coriander and salt in 2 quarts of water. When done, remove chicken from broth, shred it and put it aside, then strain the broth.

Chop onions, pepper, tomatoes and saute over low heat in a small amount of oil until transparent.

Add the cooked vegetable to your broth along with the juice of 4 limes, the chicken bouillon cube and cook for 10 min then strain the broth again.

To serve, use a deep dish, add the chicken, fried tortilla strips and a slice of lime in your hot chicken broth
